



| ICM Poll for BBC Cymru Wales

Fieldwork dates: 19-23rd February 2010

Interview Method: Telephone.

Population effectively sampled: All adults aged 18+ in GB

Sampling Method: Within Wales, a random sample of telephone numbers was drawn from the entire BT database of domestic telephone numbers. Each number so selected had its last digit randomised so as to provide a sample including both listed and unlisted numbers.

Sample size: 1,000 adults aged 18+

Data weighting: Data were weighted to the profile of all Welsh adults aged 18+ (including non telephone owning households). Data were weighted by sex, age, social class, household tenure, work status. Targets for the weighted data were derived from the National Readership survey, a random probability survey comprising 34,000 random face-to-face interviews conducted annually.

Questions: The computer tables attached in PDF format show each question, in full, in the order they were put to respondents, all response codes and the weighted and un-weighted bases for all demographics and other data including but not limited that published .
